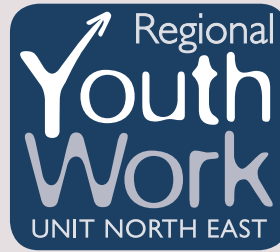

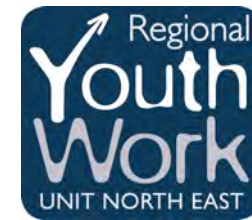

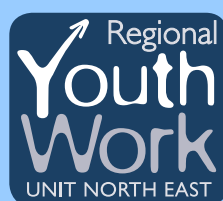

The Future for Youth Work?

Background

Youth Work is at a time of significant change, the current challenges, threats, and opportunities faced by statutory and voluntary services will determine the shape of youth work over the coming years. The development of integrated services, the commissioning of youth work provision and the active engagement of young people in setting policy and developing programmes are presenting a range of opportunities but also a number of threats to the essence of youth work.

In this conference, the Unit is striving to promote debate and discussion about the future for youth work. How the profession can engage in current developments, whilst pertaining the core ethics and values which determine good youth work practice. Through the conference we are aiming to gain the views of youth work professionals, colleagues from associate professions, planners and funders to contribute to the national debate.
